The Risks of Poor Incident Management

Issues

- Lack of clear direction
- Lack of communication
- Duplication of roles / effort
- Different agencies with different methods
- Conflicting priorities

Potential outcomes

- Slow, indecisive, [perceived] under-response?
- Loss of control operationally/financial?
- Lasting environmental damage?

Observations

- More organisations adopting ICS
- ICS demonstrated the potential to manage multi agency, complex incident
- Easier to engage with an ICS structured organisation

- Current non-ICS framework is working
- Strict terminology
- Paper driven process?






ICS and IMS

- Strict application of terminology and processes






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
Structured organisation

- Clearly defined roles and responsibilities






Structured planning cycle




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- A process for "management by objectives"
 - Statement of goal for the incident response (Achievable, Measurable, Time and Location parameters)
 - Objectives underpinned by strategies and tactics






Incident Action Plan (IAP)



Manageable span of control





More Principles of IMS

- Standardisation of terms
- Modular Organisation
- Anyone in the structure has one manager
- Established transfer of Command





Final thoughts

- In a major incident, success comes from government and industry "working together"
